1. APOLOGIES

1011-047 Apologies were received from Mr G Taylor, Mrs H Eynon, Mr J Fowkes, Mr S Tilley Mr F Bather (ESBC) and Mrs M Fowkes (ESBC).

2. MINUTES OF MEETING HELD TUESDAY 4th MAY 2010

1011-048 These previously circulated minutes were approved and signed as a true and accurate record after a proposal by Mrs K Winson, which was then seconded by Mrs V Atkin.

MINUTES OF MEMORIAL MEETING HELD FRIDAY 30th APRIL 2010

These previously circulated minutes were approved and signed as a true and accurate record following a proposal from Mrs K Winson, seconded by Mrs V Atkin.

3. ITEMS REQUESTED FOR DISCUSSION

1011-049 Mrs V Atkin - Evening Event for 2nd October

Mr McDonald had kindly agreed to arrange a quiz night for the evening with the Parish Council making a financial contribution of £30 plus a gift for each of the markers. All money raised to go to Charity. The event should be "bring your own drink". Mrs V Atkin proposed that Mr McDonald be asked to proceed with the event, this was seconded by Mr S J Campion with all present in favour.

1011-050 Clerk - Quarterly

The Clerk distributed a draft of the publication. Mr L Milner provided some information on waste metal collectors and cold call security. It was agreed to include these on the publication.

1011-051 S J Campion - Community Day

Members were asked about availability on the afternoon for the Parish Council stand. Mrs V Atkin, Mrs K Winson and Mr S J Campion advised that they would be attending. Mr L Milner, Mr C Chapman and Mr M Lewis were also attending in other capacities.

4. MATTERS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES

1011-052 Clerk/ESBC - Enforcement - Dog Fouling

The Clerk advised that the Parish Council does have options with regard to owned land - a complete ban on dogs, dogs must be kept on leads or dog fouling measures currently in place. The problems with all the options is enforcement - ESBC are the enforcement authority. The Clerk advised that Enforcement acknowledged that it was a minority of dog owners that did not clean up after their dogs and the vast majority of people are responsible dog owners. Mr B Buxton advised that he was against a total ban and that any measures introduced were subject to enforcement. After some further discussion it was unanimously agreed to continue with the dog fouling measures currently in place.

5. MATTERS RAISED BY STAFFORDSHIRE POLICE, STAFFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCILLOR AND EAST STAFFORDSHIRE BOROUGH COUNCILLORS.

1011-053 PC Wood :

- Expressed that reports of anti social behaviour was low
- Advised of some recent incidents following up on intelligence received
- Mr L Milner advised of the illegal / bad parking at the last home match of Burton Albion FC - the Derby Road bus lanes were blocked and parking around the corners of Britannia Drive. A police vehicle had also been left blocking the pavement on Derby Road. PC Wood advised that resources are tight on match days and officers would be redeployed for cases of disorder. Mr C Chapman suggested that traffic wardens be put on the area for matches which are suspect to parking problems.
- Mr L Milner advised that the verge/pavement parking by users of the fishing lake was again happening.
- Mr C Chapman advised of a car crash on Bridge Street and the obstruction of parked cars in the area. PC Wood to look at the area.

Mrs E Staples (Staffordshire County Councillor) :

- Advised of her new appointment as SCC Cabinet Member for Schools.
- Confirmed the meeting with Highways Officers and that two projects had been identified for Stretton - Fairham Road and parking outside the newsagents on Main Street. Mrs Staples is currently awaiting more details on the projects from the officers.
- Confirmed that the SIDs had been in place on Derby Road but that she had been advised that the information collected from the devices was not particularly accurate. The devices are seen as a prevention rather than an information gatherer.

1011-059 Priory Centre / Station Walk Repairs - Quote

11. PROTOCOL / RUNNING ORDER FOR FORMAL EVENT - 2nd OCTOBER
1011-060 MEMORIAL ENGRAVING

Mr M Goode attended for this item on the agenda.

The Clerk advised that ESBC planning had discharged conditions 2 and 3 of the planning approval.

The Clerk distributed draft layouts of the inscription. It was unanimously agreed that the letters should be lead filled. Upon discussion it was agreed that the regiments should be centered with the names to the left.

The unveiling ceremony to take place at 2.00pm - invited guests to meet at the Priory Centre at 1.15pm. The picture unveiling to take place afterwards at the Priory Centre in the Maurice Slater Room. The Magic Attic display to be situated in the back room. Staffordshire Police to be contacted with regard to road closure and event notification. Upon discussion it was unanimously agreed that Mr M Goode be given designated responsibility to work on the Memorial Service on behalf of the Parish Council.

12. STRETTON EAGLES JFC

1011-061 Mr S J Champion advised the meeting of recent events with Stretton Eagles JFC and that he had taken over dealing with them from the Clerk. The Clerk apologised for her error with the email message and confirmed that many attempts had been made to apologise directly to Mr Shorter unsuccessfully by telephone with an email and letter being sent. A file of all correspondence was presented to the meeting. Mr S J Champion advised that a revised agreement had been sent offering two evenings following the last email. The meeting unanimously agreed that the Parish Council were not obliged or needed to justify the charge being made for the hire of the training facility. The meeting agreed that Mr Champion should continue to correspond with Stretton Eagles JFC.

Mr S J Campion proposed that the training agreements for both Stretton Eagles JFC and Stretton RS had been sent and they would be asked to confirm acceptance by the next Parish Council meeting with payment due at the September meeting. This was agreed.

1011-062 Mr L Milner :

- Requested another sign on the gate advising of no cycles on the Jinny Trail.
- Advised of trees overhanging the pavement at Lancelot Drive.
- Advised of the high bush at Rose Avenue which was in need of attention.

1011-063 Mrs V Atkin :

- Advised that groups of young people were taking boxes of drink onto the Jinny Trail in the evenings. PC Wood to be notified.

1011-064 Mr S J Campion :

- The hedge at the fishing lake on Derby Road needs attention.

1011-065 Mr B Buxton :

- Advised of the dangerous parking outside the shop on Main Street.

1011-066 Mr M Lewis :

- Enquired about a response on the bus stop issue. The Clerk advised that SCC Community Highway Liaison Officer had been asked to look at the situation.
- Expressed that the church wall was looking grubby and enquired if the church could be requested to clean it.

1011-067 Mr C Chapman :

- Commented on the bushes by the Chemist.
- Advised that vehicles turning left out of The Green area were sometimes met with overtaking vehicles head on – the parked cars on Bridge Street causing some problems. The meeting was advised that most of the dwellings on Bridge Street had garages at the rear.
